## Rethinking the Role of Local Governments in a Post COVID-19 World

International webinar on rethinking the role of local governments in a Post-COVID-19 world was organized by Centre for Gandhian Studies, Central University, Kasargod, Kerala and Centre for Rural management, Kottayam Kerala for five days (10th-14th December 2020). countries participated. Various aspects of role of local governments, especially during the ongoing pandemic, their approaches and responses to fight the pandemic were covered in 11 sessions during the five day webinar. The five day long programme, covering various aspects of role local clearly indicated government efficient approach of many local governments handling the pandemic. Local governments in many cases have responded more effectively to prevent the spread of virus. In some cases, their intervention has been found to be more effective than provincial/central interventions by government. The speakers discussed the need for more clear statement of role of officials of local government, need for community participation, need for better public health care system, need for more autonomy for local governments and facilitations of local for better governance governments.

Financial deficit, limited autonomy were some of the major challenges identified and discussed by many of the speakers. The need for capacity building was emphasized by many speakers as well as in the Key note

address (at Inaugural programme, presidential address (valedictory programme) and as part of way forward. Dr. Vijayalakshmi Vadivelu (Senior evaluation Advisor, UNDP), Prof. John Moolakattu and Dr.Jos Chathukulam highlighted the need for redefining and implementing role of local governments.
